ZONE CHAMPIONSHIPS—4-5 MARCH

*** IMPORTANT INFORMATION ***

Nominations are now open. Please log onto your ResultsHQ profile where you will see a nomination invite. Nomintions close 8am on Monday 20 February.

Zone 1 consists of Baldivis, Cockburn, Dale, Kwinana, Peel and Rockingham.

U7-8s can compete at Zones; finals will be conducted at Zones. U9-15s – athletes with the top results at Zones will be eligible to compete at States. U16-17s do not compete at Zones.

Number of event athletes may nominate for at Zones:

- U7 U9: maximum of 4 events over the two days no limit on the amount in one day
- U10 U12: maximum of 5 events over the two days no limit on the amount in one day
- **U13 U17 : maximum of 6 events over the two days -** no limit on the amount in one day
